Building on the success of the International Peace Day 2015 events, DCP delivered an afternoon of cross community activity and engagement through our 'Meet the Neighbours' event held in September 2016. DCP organised this event to gauge and measure support for the various aspects of our community relations and peace walls work. The event was aimed at residents who lived closest to, or in the shadows, of existing interface areas in the New Lodge, Tigers Bay, Limestone Road and Mountcollyer areas



Adults were given opportunities to socialise and engage on issues such as shared space, community safety, good relations and the peace walls programme. Participants were also asked to comment on the state of community relations



in these areas in order that we could measure improvements or otherwise. Whilst all this was going on with the adults, children were provided with an afternoon of entertainment including face painting, arts, crafts and a magic show! Feedback from the event was very positive with a majority of residents acknowledging a marked improvement in community relations and a significant decrease in interface violence. This was in keeping with other previous surveys of local residents

The Programme, which was developed by the IFI following consultation with all the key stakeholders, is designed to be the first stage in a process leading to the physical removal of barriers. Central and core to this work are those many residents from our communities who live in interface areas, particularly those residents who reside directly in the shadows of interface barriers. As such, detailed community consultation and agreement is imperative before any physical changes can take effect.

Each have a long history of working with young people on a cross community basis in the Duncairn area. As such, they are ideal partners to develop and deliver youth work specifically relevant to the IFI Peace Walls programme. Young people have been involved in cultural identity training, mentoring programmes and anti sectarian work which has helped to develop the necessary skills and attitudes to facilitate tolerance and mutual respect for one another.
